Welcome Back

I do hope that you had a wonderful time this Summer with your families. The children have come back to school beautifully, thank you for preparing them so well.

Staff had a very productive series of INSET days on Monday and Tuesday this week (before the children came back), which included training in Makaton, a communication system often used by young children. The whole school will be using some Makaton signs which will complement our Languages, Literacy and Communication curriculum. A really helpful video was shown to us by Mrs Meakins, which you may find helpful too https://youtu.be/tRiW0s7wWIc.

Last year the children were actively involved in helping to design a new school logo – the final votes were made on Wednesday and we have a winner:



The current school uniform logo is perfectly acceptable and we will gradually phase in this one. Every child will be given a fabric badge which could be handsewn onto uniform (it is large enough to fit over the existing logo). It will also be possible to buy additional badges via Parent Pay. I am currently waiting on prices. YC Sports and KoolSkools who are our official school uniform suppliers know about the change but will not be stocking uniform with the new logo until next year.

As you know, I have never insisted on logo'd school uniform. Children can be smart in red and grey/black whether or not it has an official logo on it. I am hoping that by enabling badges to be sewn onto uniform it will make logo'd school uniform available to everyone who wants it.

In other news, our new school website is currently with the web developers, I am hoping you will find it easier to navigate. The current website is still available and should answer nearly all questions about the day-to-day running of the school, however, please do contact us if you can't find anything you are looking for!

Booking Lunches



Please could parents book lunch for their child the day before they need it – it takes up a huge amount of time each day for teachers to ask each child what they would like. Parents are able to book lunches and make menu choices a week in advance. Please do this using Parent Pay.

As more children are now able to have universal free school meals (every child from Reception, Years 1,2 and 3) it is



becoming more and more difficult to check every child's bag to see if they have food with them or not.

If we think your child does not have lunch with them will will try to contact you, however, <u>if your child says they are having a school lunch</u> **we believe them** and book a meal on their behalf.

We hate to see children go hungry and our school cook needs to know in advance, cooking meals for almost 100 children every day is quite some task for only 2 people in our tiny kitchen.

Booking your child's meal is essential!

PE days and what to bring in school each day

Please could your child bring their PE kit (trainers, spare socks, shorts and a clean T-Shirt) in and leave it on their peg in school. We promise that if it is dirty (or becomes smelly) we will send it home! All clothing needs to be named, if we know it belongs to your child and it is not named we will write on the label. Anything not named **may** be lost forever.





Please could you make sure that your child **ALWAYS** brings a named water bottle which has fresh water in it each day. We have a water fountain in school, so children can refill it if needed.

The weather in Wales can be very unpredictable, we can often have 4 seasons in 1 day! If there is even the smallest chance of rain, please make sure your child brings a coat, we do go outside in all weathers.



Snack Money

We provide a daily fruit snack for each child in the school for £1 per week, this is subsidised by the school. Please can any payments be made via Parent Pay. Payment can be made either weekly or half termly and a reminder text goes to all parents each week – if you have already paid please do not be offended. If you do not wish for your child to have a fruit snack please let us know.

Fundraising Bake Sales

As part of our drive to help raise money for the school, we will be holding 3 bake sales, one from each Step. The first bake sale will be run by the children and parents from Step 3.

Please could any **Step 3 cake/cookie donations come into school on the morning of Friday 15**th **September**. They will then be sold on the playground at the end of the day.

School Essentials Grant

Children whose families are on lower incomes and **qualify for certain benefits** can apply for a grant of:

- £125 per learner
- £200 for learners entering year 7 (to help with increased costs associated with starting secondary school)

All compulsory school years from reception to year 11 are now eligible.

All looked after children qualify for the grant, whether they receive free school meals or not. Learners who receive free school meals due to transitional protection arrangements do not qualify.

Families are only entitled to claim once per child, per school year.

The 2023 to 2024 scheme is now open and will close on 31 May 2024.






The School Street at St Monicas CIW Primary School

St Monicas CIW Primary School is an Active Travel School and has a School Street.

A School Street is a street near a school where traffic is restricted at the beginning and end of the school day. The times that <u>Cwmdare</u> and <u>Pentyrch</u> Street will be a School Street is from **8:30am to 9:30am and 3pm to 4pm**. School Streets are operational Monday to Friday, term time only. Only vehicles with valid School Street permits, such as residents and blue badge holders, will be allowed to drive down the street.

We encourage families, staff and visitors to travel to us as actively as possible. Not only is this safer and healthier for our pupils, this forms part of Cardiff Council's vision to change the way people travel around the city and make changes to respond to the climate emergency, for clean air and to create safe and healthy communities.

This means that we ask you to walk, cycle or scoot to us if you possibly can, or use public transport to get to us. We try to limit cars to our school, if you feel you have to travel by car then please park 10 minutes away and walk the last leg of your journey to school. This ensures all of our pupils are safe.
