


9th January 2024 Welcome back to school

I'd like to respectfully remind parents that any clubs after school are not a free childminding service. These are clubs which staff and children are interested in, developing skills and interests which may well develop into a lifelong hobby. It is not possible for us to extend either the age range or capacity of each club as it would detrimentally impact the experience for the children it was intended for. It is expected that children are collected promptly at 4.20pm by a responsible adult known to the school and identified on the booking form.

There will be a waiting list in operation for any applications over 20 places. Should a child change their mind about taking part in the club or fail to attend for more than 2 sessions, their place will be offered to the next child on the waiting list.
