All staff will be taking part in training linked to the Curriculum for Wales, Additional Learning Needs and Safeguarding (Child Protection)

The last INSET day after this we have is on 22nd July 2024, therefore children will break up for the Summer break on Friday 19th July.

The decision has now been made by the Local Authority and St Monica's Governing Body to allow St Monica's to grow, by giving permission for us to have our own nursery and move to a larger building.

Any changes will take place in September 2025, affecting all children currently in Reception, Years 1, 2, 3 and 4. There will be a lot of work happening in the background in the interim period as we start to plan for these changes.

The school website has a link to a current consultation we have open about a new admissions policy, which was written in the hopes that the decision would be for us to have a nursery and be able to increase our intake number a little. We do have some places available in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 but all other year groups are now full with waiting lists. The ability to grow and meet the demand from parents for places in our school in the future will be a blessing!

I'd like to take this opportunity to thank the Governing Body for their patience and willingness to attend additional Governing Body meetings over the last couple of terms. The consultation process and consequent statutory proceedings can be onerous with many, many documents to read through and make decisions on. I thank them wholeheartedly for their desire to see the long term future of faith based education ensured for many future pupils of St Monica's.

We are making very good progress towards our School Development Plan targets. The recent (8th January) INSET day enabled us to focus on Literacy, Numeracy, digital skills and health and wellbeing across the cluster. Our view of what good standards look like in all of those areas was confirmed by other teachers and staff in Cathays High, Gladstone Primary, Allensbank Primary and Albany Primary.

Tomorrow, Governors will be completing a Learning Walk as they develop their understanding of the Religion, Values and Ethics (RVE) curriculum across the school. Following the removal of the scaffolding and the hard work of Helping Hands and Mr Wood, the Step 2 outdoor learning environment has been developed beautifully.
