## How to help your child to do really well in school

Your child really succeeds in school when we are able to work in partnership with home, to celebrate your child's achievements as well as give our professional guidance on where they need to focus their efforts next. We held our teacher/parent consultations earlier this term and I am disappointment by how many missed appointments there were.

We know that there are some <u>very rare occassions</u> when it is not possible to make an appointment, for example if you have been admitted into hospital or have been arrested by the Police – otherwise the expectation is for you to support your child's education so that they can thrive and do God's work in the world.

Many children were disappointed that their parents didn't come and see their work. It can give a very poor message about the value some parents place on their child's education, I find this very surprising given how well educated and accomplished many of our parents are.


Teachers were understandably disappointed, having prepared all of the chidlren's books and digital work, ensured all of the personalised progress records for each child were ready and any specific letters/permissions were ready to be signed for interventions etc. They were also dismayed at the looming scale of the additional workload to try to rearrange appointments in their own time. I am nopt able to release staff again for another whole day to catch up on appointments which were missed and will not allow staff to use their planning time (or intrude on their family time) either.


